ATHLETICS REFUND POLICY

Prior to the registration deadline refunds will be issued in full. Once the deadline has passed for the specific activity refunds will not be issued. A participant wishing to withdraw from a league that has not been canceled by the Person County Recreation, Arts and Parks Department must request to be withdrawn in writing at least one week before the scheduled start of the league's first practice. If the situation should arise where a player drops after uniforms have been ordered the parent may receive a refund for the cost of the shirt/jersey if they have not collected the jersey. Exception: Adult sports team registration fees are not refundable unless the league is cancelled by Person County Parks and Recreation Department. A participant may request a refund for unforeseen medical or substantial hardship condition prior to team assignments. The request must be made in writing. The participant may receive a full or partial refund based on a case by case view.
